- Mr. Schoenhals expressed concern with asking parents directly for money because we don't want parents to feel uncomfortable or seem like the school is asking parents for money when we already have fundraisers in place.
- Sommer motioned for the PTA to fund the \$669.00 for second set of blocks. Jennifer

 Neeley seconded the motioned and it was approved for PTA to fund \$669.00 for the blocks. There was an idea for PTA to fund in the missing amount as well in case the rest of the money needed is not raised. The idea was not motioned or put up for a vote. Jennifer Neeley seconded the motioned and it was approved for PTA to fund \$669.00 for the blocks.

Teacher Presentations:

Mrs. Haley and Mrs. Trail gave a presentation on the happenings of 1st grade. They requested \$100 for each classroom to update their take home book library (leveled books). They are currently sending home 5 books a week with students and want to make

sure kids are getting different books to read at their levels. They will purchase the books through Scholastic as it is a cheap way to purchase them and the books are already leveled.

- _ ___ A question was raised: Does the school fund any classroom materials? Mrs. Schoenhals said the school does have a budget for materials, however, primary grades tend to use more disposable materials while the upper grades use materials for projects which tend to be more expensive. New curriculum materials were purchased for teachers, but that didn't include individual books for kids.
- ____Something else to keep in mind, we have 150 Chrome Books, where are 4-years-old, and we need to think of the future as these will need to be replaced. They have a shelf-life of 4-5 years. In addition, we started a Robotics class in middle school and up front that costs \$5,000.00.
- Teachers are given a classroom budget of \$100 to begin the school year, but that is used to set up the classroom.

- Question raised: Can parents donate books?
 Yes, they can, however, the teachers would like specific titles and levels.
- ____ Motion raised by Jennifer Neeley to fund the \$100 per classroom for new books. Seconded my Tarro McCray. \$200 (Total) approved for new leveled books for first grade).

Becca Peters: Box Tops for Education Update:

- There is a Box Tops App to earn bonus points. She put it on the PTA Facebook page. You can scan receipts and earn bonus points. Everyone would have their own user account and the bonus points go directly to Quest. She will continue to send in the paper Box Tops as well.
- Becca will no longer be doing monthly classroom contests, but will instead have a power month schoolwide. This will cut down on costs of throwing a monthly party and that extra money will go toward the community garden.
 (Anything over \$1,800 gross income)
- There will be a contest October 21 for students to vote what special idea will go in the community garden, i.e. benches, a weather

station, books about gardening/plants, etc. This will be a community partnership. We also need to budget \$750 for shipping the paper Box Tops and for the field day waterslide.
